

Easter Egg Hunt

On Holy Saturday, at Noon the Easter Bunny walks out onto the front lawn with Father Mahoney and begins the annual Easter Egg Hunt. In 10 minutes the hunt is over, as children snatch up 1,000 eggs!

Our job is to put the yellow caution tape all around the front lawn so everyone knows the parameters of the Easter Egg Hunt. Then we have to distribute 1,000 eggs onto the front lawn.

Some teens will coach the little children who are not so competitive to get eggs, and for those who are extraordinarily competitive, to encourage them to share. Teens also watch out for toddlers who may be crying because they don't have enough eggs, and the teens bring them some extra eggs.

One very lucky teen gets to be the rabbit, and dons the complete costume. Once out on the front lawn, the Easter Bunny does not speak, but crouches down to say hello and to take pictures with oodles of little children.

At the end, we gather the stakes and yellow tape, and clean up the front lawn.

All of this takes about 90 minutes. Volunteers come at 11:00, and are ready to go home at 12:30 or earlier.
